





Celebrating our 27th year as the Texas Cavaliers' charitable arm, the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation presents this annual report as testimony of our commitment to children. King Antonio and his royal entourage promote joy and fun for children, our military friends and the entire community during Fiesta, elevating spirits, raising funds and distributing grants to children's charities. The philanthropic mission of this Foundation is to improve children's lives in a myriad of ways.

Since the inauguration of the Texas Cavaliers in 1926, we've been building relationships — within our family of Cavaliers and within the community. Our civic, social, patriotic and service organization has sponsored the Fiesta River Parade since 1940, spreading goodwill, visiting schools, hospitals, non-profit organizations and military installations, handing out golden coins and Fiesta medals and sprinkling royal magic throughout the land. More than 250,000 Fiesta fans attend the River Parade each year and the sales from those tickets are the primary fundraiser for The Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation. Many of those tickets are also given as gifts to children, their families, our charitable recipients and military families. That's another way we propagate cheer.

This Foundation, established in 1989 when the economy was mired in trouble, was founded in hope, faith and a sense of community responsibility. Spearheaded by veteran Texas Cavalier Fred Middleton, the Foundation began with just \$14,000; today, the corpus has grown to \$3.5 million, thanks to the generosity of the Texas Cavaliers and others who honor friends and family through memorials and special gifts, give to the Lewis Hart Society and the Silver Knights, and support the River Parade, New Member Auction, Annual Fishing Weekend and Annual Golf Tournament. Our gifts have grown exponentially, this year reaching a record \$571,335 in support of children's causes.

Helping kids makes us feel like kings.







2016 was an extraordinary year for the Texas Cavaliers Foundation. Your generosity and hard work brought joy, healing, hope, education, safety, shelter, voice and more to thousands of area children. Your gifts made it possible for King Antonio to present \$571,335 to children's charities, including \$256,500 to KIPP San Antonio, a gift that brings name recognition along with the gratitude of KIPP students, parents, educators and administrators.

When you're driving on South I-35 and you see the Texas Cavaliers Gymnasium, be proud of what your generosity has forged. You are a catalyst for dynamic change in our community. You volunteered. You put in countless hours of planning, organizing, showing up in your uniforms and bringing delight to all who benefitted from the Texas Cavaliers' iconic contributions to Fiesta San Antonio.

We withstood the great rains of Fiesta 2016 and when the sun came out, the River Parade went on as planned. We visited hundreds of schools, hospitals, military installations, charitable organizations and other sites, soaking up the happiness we saw in the bright, shiny faces of children who must have dreamed sweet dreams after hugging a king. Knowing we were spreading royal merriment to little ones and making San Antonio a magical place for 10 thrilling days was a great honor.







Our Gift to KIPP San Antonio:

The Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation Gymnasium

In 2016, The Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation's 2016 charitable giving marked a historical milestone in our commitment to children's causes. The Foundation's \$50,000 gift to KIPP San Antonio was doubled by a matching \$50,000 gift from Texas Cavalier Zach Lee and the Quincy and Estine Lee Foundation. With individual gifts from our family of Cavaliers, the gift burgeoned to \$256,500.

As a result of this extraordinary capital gift, the Foundation has earned naming rights for the first time in its history.

The Texas Cavaliers Gymnasium on the new KIPP Cevallos K-12 campus will serve over 1,500 students each year.

We lend this support because the majority of students at KIPP San Antonio face a tough road: 86% are economically disadvantaged, 33% have limited English proficiency, 98% are students of color, 90% do not have a college graduate in the family, 60% of 9th graders in their neighborhoods are expected to drop out before graduation, and 95% are not expected to graduate from a four-year college.

And we lend this support because, despite these odds that might otherwise impede them, 100% of KIPP University Prep graduates have earned college acceptance and over \$8 million in college scholarship offers in the past two years.

How could Parade Marshal Trey
Embrey and the Texas Cavaliers
Charitable Foundation resist supporting these visionary campuses
where learning is energetic, innovative
and contagious? For more than 10
years, KIPP's focus on a committed
and meaningful collaboration among
parents, students and teachers has

redefined what is possible in public education. Learning comes first and college graduation is the goal.

That's the kind of mission the Texas Cavaliers Foundation loves. Imagine free college preparatory schools where children develop the knowledge, skills, character and habits they need to succeed in life. Where students also ignite promise in their siblings and extended families. These aren't just schools. They are instruments of change.

In providing quality education for historically underserved children, KIPP schools are infusing new life in our workforce and achieving the Texas Cavaliers' greatest passion — changing children's lives for the better.

In recognition of what KIPP schools are doing for K-12 students in six high-performing public charter schools within San Antonio's urban core, including two elementary schools and three middle schools, the Texas Cavaliers Foundation awarded KIPP with its largest single gift since the inception of the Foundation. This partnership gives us deep pride in the power of charitable dollars to transform children's lives in meaningful, measurable ways.



Respite Care of San Antonio

In a tree-lined, mixed-use neighborhood on the near north side, the lively sounds of children waft from several cheerful, repurposed vintage homes. If you pay a visit, you immediately sense that this place is different. It's a safe haven, the children are special, the staff fully attuned. And you feel really good to know that the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation contributed a gift to Respite Care of San Antonio in 2016.

Within these secure walls and on these adaptive playgrounds, children with developmental disabilities find a loving place to make friends and spend a few hours so their families can have a much-deserved break from the unwavering demands of caring for a child with special needs. Staff is fully trained to respond to the emergencies that can befall a child with autism, cardiac issues, cerebral palsy, seizures and other challenges.

Cara Magrane, COO of this amazing organization, takes the crises in stride because remaining calm and fearless is what differentiates this staff. She says, "We are the only Daycare and Mothers' Day Out in the city strictly devoted to children with disabilities and their non-disabled siblings. It's so rewarding to know we're taking care of these children so their parents can run errands and spend time with

friends and family without having to negotiate medical equipment and public behavioral issues. We also offer Mothers' Day Out, Friday Night Parents' Night Out and Saturday Family Day. It's a beautiful thing for families to have these respites so they can recharge."

Respite Care also houses a 24-hour emergency shelter for children in crisis. If they have been injured or abused, here they are protected in a calm, nurturing, and stable place as they transition to placement with family or foster care.

On an average day, Respite Care children number 100, and every child has a story that endears him or her to the hearts of the staff. Whether the noise is joyful or tearful, it's good. They're safe and loved. "There's never a dull moment," Magrane says. "It's so much fun and such a very hard job all at the same time."







Fulfilling our Mission to Support Children's Charities

Never in the 27-year history of the Texas Cavaliers Foundation have we been more gratified than in 2016 when we celebrated the first naming opportunity for this organization. The Texas Cavaliers Foundation Gymnasium on the KIPP Cevallos campus, visible from I-35, offers striking testimony to our mission and our commitment to helping children. Including our \$256,500 gift to KIPP San Antonio, King Antonio XCIV presented a total \$571,335 to local children's charities, thanks to your generosity.
