It's an incredible feeling to go from being an ordinary Joe to reigning as King Antonio. You put on that uniform and hat with the red plume, and children's faces light up in joy. It's magic. What a privilege to bring cheer to kids in hospitals, to see the wonderful, selfless work so many non-profits are doing for children, and to give money to charities that will brighten the prospects of kids who are the face of our future. This was a great and humbling honor.

There were many remarkable moments that will stay with me. Visiting Sunshine Cottage and knowing this innovative school was founded by the family of John White, a fellow Cavalier – and seeing how commendably they are educating these children. The kids put on a very moving presentation that had everyone in my court in tears.

Handing over a check for \$814,900 to Morgan's Wonderland was an especially significant happening. We were able to interact with the children and see the happiness they find in that magical place.

Our work with Zapatos, Inc. also was unforgettable. We brought new shoes and socks to kids whose shoes were worn, ragged and ill-fitting – it was a transformational moment for them, and for us.

All of this was made possible by a men's social organization that started in 1926 and has become a major benefactor for children's charities. That doesn't happen without a lot of hard work and generosity, and I thank every single one of you for your contributions.

In 2019, our 30th year of service, the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation hit some impressive milestones that illustrate the profound effect of the dollars our Texas Cavaliers and friends invest in this Foundation. In addition to the generous donations to our Adopt-a-Charity and Endowment funds, Texas Cavaliers members contribute about \$200,000 in sponsorship dollars and in-kind goods and services to the Foundation every year. This partnership allows us to keep our overhead low and do more for the kids.

First, thanks to Parade Marshal Scott Christy and all who lent their support to the 75th Texas Cavaliers River Parade, King Antonio XCVII Roger Hill and his court were able to deliver \$1,500,000 in life-changing grants to 67 children's charities. Our biggest grant to date, \$814,900, will help Morgan's Wonderland continue its phenomenal work on behalf of special needs children.

Next, Bob Worth and the Endowment Campaign Committee raised \$103,300 in fiscal year 2018-19, and an additional \$20,000 in pledges – giving us the financial strength to present our first endowment gift – \$50,000 to St. PJ's Children's Home. We awarded another \$79,000 in matching funds, and soon the new Texas Cavaliers Welcoming Center at St. PJ's will serve as a visible testament to your generosity.

If you're wondering how you can make the biggest impact with your philanthropic gifts, I urge you to consider the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation. Our thorough vetting of every requesting charity, including site visits, is your assurance of professional due diligence. Further, prudent investment strategies and scrupulous stewardship have built a robust foundation that is respected for its positive influence on children's charities.

Investing in this foundation leverages your charitable contributions, giving every dollar the power to change the lives of children through education, healing, advocacy and hope.

Morgan's Wonderland

Whatever your age or abilities, you'll find a purely joyful experience at Morgan's Wonderland – a magical, non-profit theme park carved out of an abandoned quarry. The brainchild and heart of Gordon and Maggie Hartman, it was conceived and built in honor of their daughter Morgan, who lights up the room with her smile, undeterred by the physical and cognitive challenges she has faced throughout her life.

Children and adults with special needs find a warm sense of family here, where more than one-third of the staff is also differently abled. Everyone is welcome, embraced, stimulated, and able to take advantage of the ultra-accessible™ attractions. Hear the happy shrieks as kiddos spin on the Whirling Wonder Ferris Wheel. Board the Wonderland Express, even if you're in a wheelchair. Catch and release a fish at The Wharf. Visit Inspiration Island. Nothing can stop you.

Everywhere you go at Morgan's Wonderland, you see the pure enchantment it brings to children and adults with special needs, who are admitted at no cost. Family members and friends also have fun in the completely wheelchair-accessible park – the world's first theme park designed with special-needs individuals in mind and built for everyone to savor.

River Parade Marshal Scott Christy said, "It was a natural choice for the Texas Cavaliers to pick Morgan's Wonderland as our Charitable Honoree and award them an \$814,900 grant. They're a lot like us – they're all about helping kids and having fun. What the Hartman family, staff and volunteers have done is amazing for our community, and they have touched visitors from all 50 states and 74 other countries with their innovative, inclusive theme park. They inspire the Texas Cavaliers and all of us to live our lives more like they do."

Morgan's Wonderland CEO Ron Morander says the Texas Cavaliers' generous gift will bolster the organization's multi-faceted operations. Morgan's Wonderland leads an educational, anti-bullying campaign in schools across the region, and works with educators to create curriculum-based instruction onsite at the park. They're building a sports complex for Unified Sports events. They hosted the 50th anniversary summer games of Special Olympics Texas in 2019. They're building an ultra-accessible™ camp on the northern outskirts of San Antonio that will sleep 520.

We are proud to partner with this magnanimous charity and can't wait to see their future unfold.

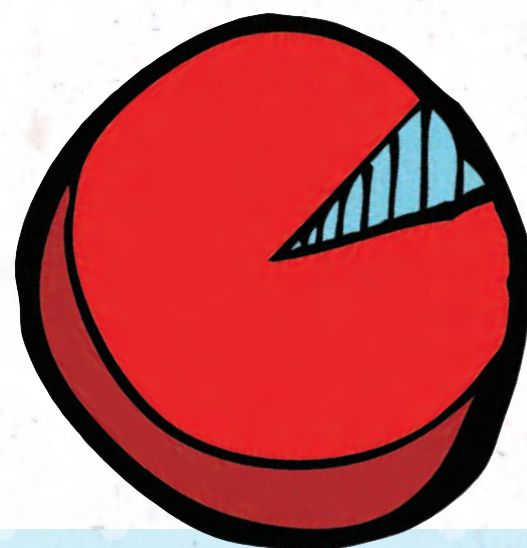

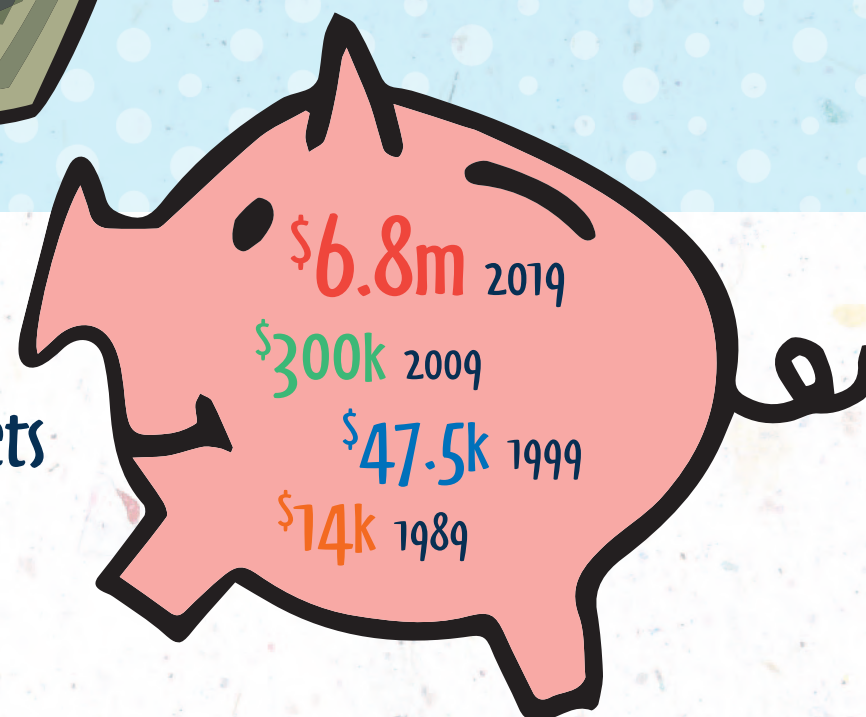
Distributions
