Proof of our commitment to children.

In the early spring, when it looked as if the COVID-19 pandemic would force postponement, and possibly even cancellation, of the 76th Annual Texas Cavaliers River Parade, the Board of Trustees of the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation (TCCF) met to map out a contingency plan.

Fiesta and the River Parade inspired the founding of the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation in 1989. A small group led by big-hearted Texas Cavalier Fred Middleton provided the \$1K in seed money, and envisioned the Foundation's mission: To encourage, foster support and conduct activities and programs which will benefit children residing within the State of Texas.

Every year, Fiesta sets the stage for this mission. King Antonio and his Royal Court visit children's charities, cheered on by little ones of every age and ethnicity in all quadrants of the city. On behalf of the TCCF, King Antonio delivers checks to dozens of non-profits that are dedicated to the education, mental/physical/emotional health, recreation, well-being, nurturing, safety and wholesome development of children.

Is it possible, in the absence of Fiesta, with the cancellation of the River Parade, to still provide grants to these organizations? Is it possible to honor our commitment, despite the loss of revenue from the River Parade?

The answer from the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation:
a resounding **YES!**

So, in a year when children's charities needed support more than ever – with the community's health and the economy in peril because of a highly contagious, life-threatening virus, the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation honored its commitment to children's charities and awarded \$2.1M in grants to 68 organizations. Because the need was so desperate at a time when many events that traditionally provide charity funding were cancelled due to the quarantine, we presented these gifts a month earlier than usual.

2020 ushered in a perfect storm. COVID-19 wreaked death and havoc, the market crashed, philanthropy was halted by fear. How could we help the children we've promised to serve under such unsettling circumstances and with so many unknowns yet to come?

The Board of Trustees of the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation met to formulate a plan when it appeared that Fiesta 2020 and the Texas Cavaliers River Parade were in jeopardy.

What could we do without the River Parade and its influx of money to support our charities? How would the Fiesta season look without festive visits to children's schools and hospitals where King Antonio distributes cheer, hope and much-needed grants to non-profits doing the hard work of inspiring, educating and healing our community's children?

And yet, in the midst of chaos, we recognized that some critical principles have not changed. We have always strived to be effective stewards of our donors' investments in the children of our community. We have a strong membership and the good faith of many caring people. We have generous donors and sponsors. With the help of the professional team at Sendero Wealth Management, we follow a conservative investment philosophy. We are positioned to continue our legacy far into the future.

Therefore, the Board's response was this: Even in a pandemic, honoring our commitment is the right thing to do. And so, we disbursed \$2.1M to 68 charitable organizations – providing critical funds to charities suffering the reverberations of the pandemic, at a time when many funders were unable to do so.

As a country, we have been through other terrible times and have rebounded. We have faith in science and humanity that we will emerge from this public health crisis stronger and we will be better for having lived through it. With the help of Texas Cavaliers, donors, sponsors and volunteers, it is our vision that Fiesta 2021 and the River Parade 2021 will be especially joyful and will provide vital support for children's charities.

We at the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation are grateful for your trust in our careful vetting of the organizations that look to us for grants, and our proven track record for prudent investments, having grown the original corpus of \$1K in 1989 to \$8M this fiscal year. Your continued support of this foundation makes miracles happen. Even in a pandemic.

Their charitable missions ignite our philanthropic spirit.

The San Antonio area is abundant with creative, selfless, heartfelt non-profit organizations committed to our community's children. They innovate ways to heal, educate, inspire and redirect the lives of children who are vulnerable and they look to us for guidance and support. We thank these 68 organizations and all who dedicate themselves to a healthier future for our children. Many of our charitable recipients tell us that the Texas Cavaliers "seal of approval" is in itself a gift because other funders see TCCF grants as a trustworthy endorsement.

Blessed Sacrament Academy Child Development Center


It's a kid's job to play.

Kids love playing in the dirt, flying through the air on swings, zooming down a slide, and chasing each other around in kid-sized four-wheelers. The TCCF is helping make this magic happen for the children up to 5 years old who are served by the Blessed Sacrament Academy Child Development Center. At this happy neighborhood place, the kiddos can be seen pulling weeds in the garden and harvesting fresh tomatoes and cucumbers they planted themselves. They're learning about nutrition, the joy of working the soil, the importance of socializing, and the incomparable happiness of simply playing. They're preparing for kindergarten and elementary school in a safe place, nurtured by caring staff.

Sister Odelia Korenek, Executive Director, says this grant from the TCCF "makes it possible for us to purchase playground equipment and supplies for the children so we can use other funds to pay our teachers during the quarantine. The teachers are still preparing lesson plans and working from home and we are committed to helping them through this difficult time."

Committed to the children and families they serve in an area of the city marked by poverty, Blessed Sacrament is providing interactive and creative videos, learning activities and other resources even during the quarantine. The playground is integral to the children's physical, emotional and intellectual development, and is used not only by children enrolled in the Child Development Center, but by children whose parents attend the Parents' Academy where they learn to reduce family stress, improve parenting and communication skills and strengthen family bonds.

Hope House

Unorthodox approach turns lost teens lives around.

George Frederick, visionary and founder of Hope House, is determined to help youth who may look like lost causes to some observers. He believes in the foster kids and other youth he encourages. They come from backgrounds similar to his – with the dark reality of drugs, alcohol, gangs and violence. Using Godly principles, laced with painful truths, he listens without judgment. He contracts with partners who've known life on the streets, and life in jail or prison, to join him in guiding youth who are referred to Hope House through BCFS Health and Human Services, Bexar County Juvenile Probation and San Antonio's Texas Can Academy.

"We help kids use their negative past experiences to find their individual strengths and power," he says. His methods are unorthodox but effective because he fully relates to the kids he serves. He speaks their language. He encourages them to pursue positive goals, to finish school and go to college. "In Texas, foster care kids can go to college tuition-free, but only 2% take advantage of that," George says. He aims to change that. Hope House has been on a feverish mission since 2004 to improve life for beleaguered East Side youth and families.

Hope House assists families with a myriad of critical needs, including rent, utilities, household appliances and furniture. Unbounded by restrictive rules, Hope House steps up to help in practical ways.

The TCCF grant to Hope House also supports the San Antonio African American Community Archive and Museum. When troubled youth visit the museum and see the possibilities for the Black community, for their own lives, it helps cement the encouraging message of Hope House. George tells young people, "You have to appreciate where you came from to appreciate where you are and where you're going."

Ricardo Salinas Pediatric Dental Clinic

Ending pain and saving smiles through dental care.

American kids miss more school because of toothaches and associated dental problems than any other reason – an astonishing total of 52 million lost hours each year, according to the National Health Interview Survey.

Those harrowing statistics led Kevin Donly, D.D.S., an impassioned advocate of oral care for children, to help found the Ricardo Salinas Pediatric Dental Clinic with the City of San Antonio. Here, thousands of San Antonio kids get professional oral care in one of San Antonio's most impoverished zip codes. Offering comprehensive services on a sliding fee scale in an area of our community where most cannot afford to pay, the clinic serves kids in a school district where 100% are eligible for free lunches.

Dr. Donly says, "If a child has decayed teeth and can't eat well because of pain, and misses school due to pain and embarrassment, it can lead to failure to thrive, damaged cognitive ability and problems that can be lifelong. That is unacceptable." The Ricardo Salinas Pediatric Dental Clinic was founded in 2003 – a unique partnership between the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District and the UT Health Advanced Education in Pediatric Dentistry program.

Each year, Salinas and three sister clinics (two in San Antonio, one in Laredo) log approximately 20,000 appointments for children (4,000 to 5,000 at the Salinas Pediatric Dental Clinic), only 35% of whom have Medicaid. Those limited Medicaid payments and rent-free space furnished by the City of San Antonio provide partial support for the clinic's operations. In addition, the UT Health Dental School supplies a full-time faculty member, and pediatric dentistry residents rotate through as part of their education, offering supervised care to pediatric clients. In addition to providing dental care, the Ricardo Salinas Pediatric Dental Clinic teaches grandparents, parents and children how to practice healthy oral care, helps kids learn to smile again, relieves their pain, and improves community health.

"We are very indebted to the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation, which has awarded critical grants for the past six years. Your support is our survival and we stretch the monies as far as we can," Dr. Donly says.
