In the 81 years since the Texas Cavaliers hosted our first Fiesta River Parade in 1940, kids have been inspiring us to do better – to spread meaningful joy wherever we go. The lively, colorful tradition of the River Parade lifts our collective spirits and sends light-hearted ripples of goodwill throughout our community. This commitment to the unique San Antonio culture has been our primary focus as a social organization.

Then ... in 1989, with the formation of the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation (TCCF), we enhanced our purpose, expanded our mission, and have since become one of the leading funders of children's charities in our city. We have parlayed the earnings of a festive event and the generosity of our members – who are leaders in business, finance, medicine, law, real estate, education and civic causes – into a philanthropic organization that is transforming the lives of our most precious resource: our community's children.



Our \$1.1m Pandemic Response:

Invest in Children's Charities

These past two years, more than ever, the TCCF has resolutely risen to the aid of hundreds of charities that are dedicated to supporting children – by providing critical funds to advance education, health, recreation, sports, the arts and special needs. The TCCF's unwavering support gives hope and help to children who are afflicted by poverty, homelessness, abuse and disabilities. At a time when many non-profit organizations have been severely hindered by the COVID-19 pandemic, and many funders have been limited in their ability to help, the TCCF Board of Directors has actualized its commitment to serve and sustain the charities it carefully vets.

The result: in FYE 6/30/2021, the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation awarded \$1.1M in grants to 83 charities serving infants, children and youth. The impact is propitious, widespread and has been known to generate small miracles. Children's lives are changed by the support, and recipient organizations benefit from the financial stimulus as well as the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation's seal of approval. The funding community recognizes that the TCCF carefully vets every applicant, every year, researching, making site visits and building connections. A grant from the TCCF is an endorsement of each grantee's mission, staff, directors and fiscal responsibility.

Members of the TCCF Board of Directors and Investment Committee are prudently selected for their business acumen, sense of stewardship and philanthropic heart. The investment policy they embrace balances a quest for a healthy return on investment with a conservative approach to protecting and preserving the Foundation's funds for maximum impact. The Board is conscious of its obligation to the more than 600 members who entrust their philanthropic giving to the TCCF, and to the children's charities that are the beneficiaries.

The TCCF is indebted to the Texas Cavaliers and our community partners who confidently entrust their charitable dollars to the Foundation. And we respect and thank the selfless, visionary leaders in our community who initiate and provide critically-needed services to children whose paths are substantively altered by their altruism.

We are especially grateful that after the pandemic cancellation of our 2020 River Parade, and postponement of our 2021 River Parade, with all of the meetings, discussions, fears and conscientious concern for public safety, we were able to host a belated Texas Cavaliers Fiesta River Parade in June, 2021. The heartfelt joy of the participants and crowds touched us deeply and reminded us that *Kids Bring Out the Best in Us*.

Amid the chaos of excited starts and anguished stops over the past two years, the Texas Cavaliers discovered something about our members: We are resilient! Despite our best laid plans, we had to make decisions in the interest of public health, and we did that. We learned to roll with the pandemic punches, and the resulting resiliency made me prouder than ever to be a Texas Cavalier.

What a time to be King Antonio! In 2020, the King had no Parade. In 2021, the Texas Cavaliers Fiesta River Parade was scheduled, postponed, and rescheduled two months later. But we did it, and the joy our Parade brought to the psyche of our city and citizens was worth the wait. Everyone was gracious, grateful and very ready to celebrate. We felt honored to contribute to the taste of normality the Parade brought to thousands of San Antonians and visitors along the Riverwalk on a very warm June evening. It may have been delayed, but it was magical. We also participated in important military events at the Ft. Sam Houston Quadrangle and Military Day on Alamo Plaza, continuing our strong affiliation with the United States Armed Forces. I thank everyone for making it happen and for hanging in there with us.

The flexibility, determination and generosity of our organization was never more evident than in the record \$1.1M in grants the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation bestowed on 83 organizations this year. Our visits were different because they took place after the school year ended ... and we missed the joyful faces of all those schoolchildren. But the places and people we visited were heartwarming, inspiring and gave us meaningful glimpses into the amazing work carried out by charitable organizations across our county. We were touched beyond words and will carry the memory of those visits for many years.

We saw the profound need among the non-profits served by the TCCF, and we witnessed how the pandemic exacerbated the disruption and losses to their operations. In response, we pumped out the grants prior to our usual April distribution date because our endowment made it possible to do so. The charitable arm of the Texas Cavaliers is making a tremendous impact on children and contributing to the healing our city needs after a tumultuous bout with COVID. When we visited the City Council, every person on the dais spoke about the difference our charitable grants are making in their districts. Those sincere expressions of gratitude were a powerful affirmation that the Texas Cavaliers are doing the right thing.

It has been a tremendous honor to represent our city as King Antonio XCVIII, and I am grateful to my fellow Texas Cavaliers; the royal entourage that visited local charities, military installations and hospitals; my Commander Barton Simpson; my Aides Wendell Hall, Tres Steves and Joe Calvert; Parade Marshal Paul Rohlf; and the Boards of Directors of the Texas Cavaliers and the TCCF. And, I am very thankful to my wife and family for their love and support. In celebrating Fiesta, we are united in remembering the Heroes of the Battle of the Alamo and the Victory at San Jacinto concluding the Texas Revolution!

As the pandemic lingers, it is a testament to our organization that despite the challenges, we are faithfully responding to the needs of the children in our community, investing in their welfare now to better their future. The grants awarded by the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation are critical to children's charities, and the impact is measurable. Again this year, the TCCF Board of Directors made the decision to proceed with full funding, and the gratitude from the community we serve has been deeply heartfelt.

We are able to do this seminal work because of the donations you generously entrust to the Foundation, the wise and prudent investment strategy that guides us, and the hard work of everyone in the Texas Cavaliers organization. The Foundation is evolving into one of our city's most visible and influential charitable arms. In the past five years, our endowment has grown from \$2.9M to over \$8M. The word is out: these guys know how to translate the proceeds from the Fiesta River Parade and their philanthropic giving into transformative grants that call attention to the extraordinary work of local children's charities.

With our burgeoning volunteer program, we've seen good deeds beget good deeds. During the pandemic, the Texas Cavaliers spearheaded a new effort to enhance our visibility and expand the way we serve. Our members spanned out into the community – building beds for kids who had none and delivering them, witnessing the delight, feeling like Santa. We donated blood. We sorted books for Book Buddies. We worked with the San Antonio Food Bank to feed the hungry. We filled bags with food for school children at Snack Pak 4 Kids. More than 100 of our members tackled numerous volunteer projects with focus, pride and a spirit of enthusiasm and compassion. Many were members of our younger Cavaliers classes whose participation gave them an appreciation for the work of the TCCF and the camaraderie of being a Cavalier.

Through the tireless efforts of our River Parade Chairman, Paul Rohlf, his amazing team, and our partnership with the amazingly generous Susan Naylor, our \$1.05 million gift to the Will Smith Zoo School was the largest grant in the history of the TCCF. Surpassing \$1 million sets a noteworthy precedent. Capital and program grants are significant, and we are grateful to all who donate and to those who serve on our Investment Advisory Committee, guided by Sendero Wealth Management, for making gifts like these possible.

Members of the Texas Cavaliers are blessed with resources – time, money, skills, leadership, and networking strengths – and when you share these assets with the charities that serve our community's children, it creates a dynamic, flourishing partnership. Together, we are truly changing the future for thousands of kids every year. I'm very proud to be a part of this organization.

Will Smith Zoo School

**A Magical Place that Nurtures Curiosity and Sparks
a Love for Science and All Living Things**

Imagine a school where happy, chattering children spend half their day outdoors, exploring a world class zoo and getting to know the animals by name, along with their native habitats, favorite foods, napping habits and quirks. A school where little ones from every quadrant of our city, ages 3, 4 and 5 learn together in culturally-diverse classrooms. Where they can get dirty, and at the end of the day, pockets full of colorful leaves and shiny rocks, they climb into their child safety seats and fall asleep on the ride home – full of joy and wonder, blissfully exhausted, to rest up for another day of learning and immersion in the splendor of nature.

Incredible as it may seem, such a school exists, and it's here in our city. Will Smith Zoo School, a modern campus on the grounds of San Antonio Zoo, qualifies as one of the happiest places you'll ever see. With a capacity for serving 224 children, the waiting list is evidence that parents know this is a captivating environment. Here, Montessori-inspired education stimulates scientific enlightenment and fearless curiosity about animals and plants, the Earth and all things in it.

Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation designated Will Smith Zoo School as its featured charity in fiscal year 2020-2021, bestowing a \$1.05M gift, the largest in the Foundation's history. This grant will provide scholarships to children who could not otherwise afford to be a part of this amazing adventure.

Mark Krenger, President of the TCCF, said, "We were delighted to partner with Susan Naylor, who matched our gift and doubled its impact. Susan was the lead donor in establishing the amazing Will Smith Zoo School, which is named for her late son."

Julie Gross, Vice President-Development, notes that the Texas Cavaliers grant "will help us foster independence, compassion and a love of learning in our students. The unique experience of our school needs to be shared, and this grant will help us meet our goal of awarding financial aid to 30% of our students." In addition to tuition assistance, the TCCF grant will enhance the school's entry plaza. "The Texas Cavaliers Plaza will remind us daily of their generous support," she said.

Will Smith Zoo School has dedicated outdoor learning environments with a dry riverbed, water sources, a gazebo, Monarch butterfly garden and a touch pond where kids can connect with tadpoles and other small aquatic life. A food forest and vegetable garden, named for Susan Naylor's son Charlie, produces healthy fruits and vegetables that the kids prepare and eat. The creativity, love of nature and unexpected adventures are boundless.

Founded in 2004 as a small pre-school located in the Zoo's Education Center, the school is now in a modern, renovated structure that earned LEED Platinum certification. The building formerly housed Sunshine Cottage and the Kipp Academy. It reopened as Will Smith Zoo School in January, 2018, and its students represent 60 zip codes.

TEAMability

Treating Every Child as if They're Going to Succeed ... And They Do

Childhood progress can be measured in many ways. A child takes his first step, learns to read, gets straight A's, wins a sports medal, graduates from high school. At TEAMability, the only organization in South Texas that provides long-term specialized services to children with complex disabilities, the parents, staff and siblings send up an exuberant cheer when a child recognizes her mother for the first time, or smiles, or lifts her head or reaches for an object. Baby steps of progress are golden highlights for a population of children that is nearly invisible to the community at large.

Barbara Goldman, Executive Director of TEAMability says, "Our kids are underserved, vulnerable, unseen, misunderstood. People don't generally grasp their needs and potential, but we see ability first and treat every child as if they're going to succeed ... and they do. Every child we serve shows progress in some developmental area, and that is a joyful thing."

They do what no one else does, and they do it with a passionate belief in each child's value and possibilities. Combining evidence-based practices from various disciplines, they achieve results that give hope to parents and promise to children whose disabilities may appear overwhelming to those outside the TEAMability mission.

Founded in 2003, the non-profit serves children from more than 25 school districts, extending as far as Austin, Del Rio and Eagle Pass. Pre-COVID, they served about 50 children each week, from birth to 22 years. Certified by Medicaid for outpatient therapy, they are now able to serve clients into adulthood because their complex, multiple disabilities require lifelong services. Soon, TEAMability will operate out of the Multi-Assistance Center at Morgan's Wonderland, broadening the scope of services and clientele of both agencies.

Goldman says, "When King Antonio and his entourage visit, they hold the kids on their laps and engage with them. For our kids to receive shiny medals and wear fancy hats is a rare and wonderful treat. Our parents are thrilled that the Cavaliers recognize the humanity in their children and are not uncomfortable with their disabilities." This year's site visit so impressed King Antonio XCVII Phil Bakke that he lent his affirmation with a very generous personal check.

TEAMability offers a shining ray of optimism for children who often are seen by others as hopeless, and for parents already immersed in the emotional toll and cost burden of a child with complex disabilities, access to these extraordinary services at no cost is a gift. Grants from the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation help make it possible for TEAMability to change the world for these families.
