Through the continued generosity, skill and hard work of the Cavaliers and its charitable partners, the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation has had another remarkable year. We were able to contribute more than \$2 million to 87 children's charities to assist them in providing vital services to those most

needy. In addition, in the aftermath of the unthinkable tragedy in Uvalde, we donated a vehicle to the Children's Bereavement Center to allow its staff to travel to Uvalde and provide much needed counseling services to children. The Charitable Foundation is making a significant impact in our community.

In addition to contributing monetarily to children's charities, we worked with them side by side. For instance, we held our 1st Annual Cavaliers Care Citywide Community Service Day where more than 150 Cavaliers and family members helped our charitable beneficiaries with various projects throughout the city and county. Haven for Hope

Breaking the Cycle of Homelessness

Since opening in 2010, Haven for Hope has served more than 2,000 families and 4,000 children in need of safe shelter, along with more than 33,000 individuals. With the pandemic, inflation, housing shortage and soaring rents, the transformational campus has seen an explosion in families seeking shelter. Chief Development Officer Celeste Eggert notes, "We do not turn away any families. We take them in when they need us. If we have no space in our family dorm, we use our chapel, classrooms, and offices." That decision has had an enormous impact on the staff and budget, neither of which necessarily increases despite demand for services.

Although the family dorm was designed to accommodate no more than 82 families, Haven often has up to 150 families, which usually includes over 300 children from infants to teens. "People are shocked to find we serve children, and so many. Over 20% of our population is children under the age of 15," Eggert says.

To avoid further disruption in their lives, Haven and a Communities in Schools staff person assure all children stay enrolled in their schools and get the appropriate supplies and uniforms. If behavioral problems occur, they help avert crises. Haven oversees bus service to 62 schools in 11 districts, including 11 charter schools. To preserve their dignity, the buses pick up the Haven children first and drop them off last so the other children do not know they are in a homeless shelter.

In the summertime, Haven partners with Girls, Inc. and Boys and Girls Clubs, "who show compassion for our kids and truly welcome them," Eggert says. While at Haven, they are safe, protected, nourished, healthy, and afforded the services they and their parents need to survive and thrive. "Our goal for the kids is to make homelessness a brief, one-time episode. We don't want them to end up here as adults. Haven empowers individuals and families to transform their lives and avoid repeated homelessness with our early intervention approach."

Haven for Hope considers the Texas Cavaliers and the Charitable Foundation to be among their most faithful and generous partners. "The Cavaliers have supported Haven since 2010, and this year's grant came at a critical time as the surge of families continues. Your gifts help us buy essentials such as baby strollers, car safety seats, clothing and school uniforms. Security is also important on a campus with so many people moving in and out each day, and this grant helped us replace many of our aging security cameras," Eggert says. "And they don't just write a check ... they're here year 'round showing their support."



A 2022 Grant Recipient **Wonders & Worries**

A mom is diagnosed with cancer. Confused and frightened, her kids withdraw or act out.

When a parent suffers a health crisis, Wonders & Worries gently steps in and alleviates the emotional turmoil. Their certified child life specialists work with children whose parents are suffering a serious health crisis to educate them at an age-appropriate level regarding the diagnosis, treatment, and side effects. They build trust, help anxious children express their feelings and guide them in developing coping skills. They empower. They support the family, allay concerns, open the lines of communication, and provide a safe place for children to share their distress.

Meredith Cooper, Co-Founder of Wonders & Worries, is a child life specialist whose work in pediatric oncology inspired her to help families that had nowhere to turn when a parent was diagnosed with a serious illness. "Approximately 18% of adults with cancer have a child under 18 living in their home. I became aware of the need to support children who were scared and confused," she said.

Twenty years ago, she founded Wonders & Worries, which this year served more than 300 children and parents from over 125 families at no charge in the greater San Antonio area. The gratitude of parents, overwhelmed by their own fears, is profound. Some 47% of their clients have incomes of \$50K or less and are beset with financial constraints, in addition to terrifying

medical concerns and anxiety over the future for their children. Referrals from cancer centers, schools and other sources jumped 22% this year.

Michelle, a client who is a single mom to an 11-year-old boy, learned she had breast cancer and was consumed with questions about her son. She wondered, "Should I tell him? What do I tell him? How do I tell him? What if he asks me if I am going to die? How would I answer that? If I were to die, who will take care of him? How will our lives change?" When she was referred to Wonders & Worries, she said, "They took away my greatest worry and gave me some peace of mind that allowed me to focus my energy on my treatment while still trying to keep life as normal as I could for him."

Michelle's story has been repeated hundreds of times, and Wonders & Worries has been there with compassion and expertise. Meredith said, "This grant from the Texas Cavaliers will help us continue to serve children at no charge from the very beginning of the family's journey. It means everything to our clients."

Alamo Education Center

Honoring Heroes and Keeping History Alive

When the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation pledged \$5M to the Alamo Trust for the multi-faceted Texas Cavaliers Alamo Education Center, their gift was the largest yet recorded, and continues to inspire others to support the \$300M revitalization project of the famed Shrine of Texas Liberty.

Each year, 140,000 schoolchildren visit the Alamo and learn about Texas history. Kate Rogers, Executive Director of the Alamo Trust, says, "The new Education Center will be a game changer for children – an inviting, kid-friendly setting with participatory learning that uses technology to experience history. We are so grateful to the Texas Cavaliers, who demonstrated exceptional leadership with this critical gift. Thanks to their vision and faith in this project, we expect to nearly double the number of schoolchildren from around Texas and the U.S. who will visit the Alamo annually and experience memories that will last a lifetime."

Supporting the ambitious Alamo Trust campaign aligns with the Texas Cavaliers' purpose as stated in its bylaws, which read in part: "The Association was initially created and exists to honor the memory of the matchless heroes who fell at the Alamo and whose blazing pyres lighted the way to victory and independence at San Jacinto."

TCCF President Bill Kingman said, "This partnership merges the Cavaliers' long connection to the Alamo with our commitment to children. The Center, with a lecture hall, distance learning studio, individual classrooms, and an agricultural garden, will recognize the history of the Alamo and the San Antonio area, and will honor the battle for Texas' independence and the memory of the heroes of the Alamo."

Rogers said, "The Education Center will ensure that future generations of Texans will understand why the Alamo means so much to Texans." She added that the Center also plans to offer world class programming for teachers – a week-long immersive experience that allows them to stand in the place where history was made, and to take those lessons back to their classrooms. "We are excited for this opportunity to enrich children's appreciation of history and to treat teachers as valued professionals in gratitude for all they do for our children."

Completion of the Alamo project is expected to coincide with the Texas Cavaliers' Centennial in 2026.
