Welcome!!! This year marks the 75th Texas Cavaliers River Parade. Celebrating such a milestone called for the perfect theme, something that would help celebrate all San Antonio has to offer. "It's SHOWTIME in San Antonio" is a vibrant and exciting theme that commemorates all the fun and amusement that live music, theatre, sports, and the Hollywood silver screen bring to our lives. "It's SHOWTIME" comes to life on each of the 51 professionally decorated entries, and the costumed float participants and great local live bands will compete for our first prize of \$3,500 before our local celebrity judges.

The Texas Cavaliers organization was established 93 years ago to honor the memory of the brave heroes who gave their lives at the Alamo, to encourage horsemanship in the age of the automobile, and to foster relationships with the U.S. military. In addition to hosting the River Parade annually, the Cavaliers also raise money to help fund some of the city's vital non-profit organizations through our Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation (TCCF) and the Adopt-a-Charity program, which will financially support 67 local children's charities in 2019.

Today and every day, the Texas Cavaliers are focused on what we can do to make a difference in the lives of San Antonio's children. This year, the TCCF will give more than \$1.5 million dollars to support children in need through our vetted grant applicants. Please see page 145 in this program for a complete list. In fact, to date, the Cavaliers have given more than \$8 million to support San Antonio's children.

Each year, the Texas Cavaliers River Parade selects a Charitable Honoree to receive additional funds and added publicity. Everyday Morgan's Wonderland & Morgan's Inspiration Island "Rolls out the Red Carpet and puts on a show" for visitors by providing a safe, clean and beautiful environment free of physical and economic barriers that all children - regardless of special need or disability - can visit and enjoy. In fact, more than I million patrons have visited Morgan's Wonderland from all 50 states and over 67 countries since opening 10 years ago. Funds raised from tonight's parade and TCCF Adopt-a-Charity donations will fund future capital improvements at an "in the works" facility at Wonderland, Texas, that will be announced publicly in the near future by Morgan's Wonderland leadership. A special children's area of the facility will bear the Texas Cavalier name and continue our tradition of serving ALL the children of San Antonio and South Texas. The Texas Cavaliers are proud to present Morgan's Wonderland with another record setting grant for over \$800,000 to the Parade's Charitable Honoree! We would like to recognize Susan Naylor and the Will Smith Foundation, who have generously given the Texas Cavalier's Charitable Foundation a lead gift of \$250,000, as well as the incredible dollar-for-dollar match from the Gordon Hartman Family Foundation that has allowed for our record donation to Morgan's Wonderland.

Our commemorative River Parade program cover is graced by the artwork created by Brooke Baker, a 5th grade student at Raba Elementary in Northside ISD. Brooke is the Margaret Casillas Grand Prize winner of our annual River Parade Art Contest, which is celebrating its 15th year! Brooke's art was selected from 1,776 entries from 74 different elementary schools. The Texas Cavaliers presented the 17 schools with grants totaling \$46,000 to help fund their schools' art programs. Special thanks to Bank of America and the Kittie Nelson Foundation for their generous sponsorships of the Art Contest!

LEON COFFEE

Honorary Grand Marshal

Luke "Leon" Coffee is an entertainer who has starred on the big screen; 8 Seconds (1994), Jericho (2000), and My Heroes Have Always Been Cowboys (1991) and performed live for more than 40 years, entertaining hundreds of thousands of people. He has worked the National Finals Rodeo for over four decades, always with his familiar green hat and painted on happy face.

Born in Blanco, Texas, Leon grew up around horses and rodeos. At age 9 he competed at the Little Britches Rodeo and won "All Around Cowboy." He continued his career as a junior rodeo contestant in bull riding, bareback riding, steer wrestling, and calf roping. Following high school graduation, he joined the U.S. Army and served his country for three years, mostly in Vietnam.

After encouragement from a fellow bullfighter Coffee began fighting bulls instead of riding them. His signature act of dancing in front of an angry bull earned him the nicknames "Disco Bullfighter" and "Boogie Man." As a PRCA Gold Card Member and NFR barrel man, Coffee is one of three career cowboys in ProRodeo to be both a barrel man and a bullfighter at the National Finals Rodeo.

But his career has not been all laughs and smiles. As a professional bullfighter, he has broken more than 130 bones. "I've had so many broken bones," Coffee said. "One hundred thirty-one of them. Different breaks. Same breaks. Every finger, arms, back broken, neck. Fourteen knee surgeries, one spine surgery. I ran (motorcycle daredevil) Evel Knievel a close race for broken bones -- and I won." On one horrific night in 1986 while he was appearing at the Washington State Fair, he was kicked in the head by an enraged bull, He died that night, Five times. In fact, his career injuries, including an almost fatal bout of spinal meningitis in 2012 and heart attack in 2015, fills a three-page medical dossier, but his "It's Showtime" attitude makes him the perfect Honorary Grand Marshall for the Texas Cavaliers Fiesta River Parade.

Since 1973, the Texas cowboy fought bulls at the National Finals Rodeo (NFR) twice (1979, 1984) and was a barrel man at the NFR in 1991, 1994 and 1997. Coffee also worked at the first National Circuit Finals Rodeo in 1987; Texas Circuit Finals Rodeo (1980-82, 1992, 1996-97, 2003-04); Canadian Finals Rodeo (1985 and 1986). Lone Star Circuit Finals Rodeo bullfighter in 1980 and 1982, Copenhagen Cup Finals barrelman, Wrangler Bullfight Tour Finals barrelman, National Finals Rodeo barrelman.

Other awards and distinctions include:

- Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA) Hall of Fame
- National Cowboys of Color Hall of Fame
- San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo Hall of Fame
- Professional Rodeo Cowboy Association Clown of the Year in 1983 and was in the top three every year from 1984-2001.

In May, Coffee will be inducted into the Bull Riding Hall of Fame, a non-profit organization that recognizes and commemorates the legends of the sport. In his off time, you'll see him running his ranch in Blanco County. Leon is married to Terri.



2019 Téxas Cavaliers Charitable Honoree



This year's Texas Cavaliers River Parade honoree – non-profit Morgan's Wonderland in Northeast San Antonio – it is a place unique in all the world. It's the first and only theme park designed with special-needs individuals in mind and built for everyone's enjoyment. Encompassing 25 acres, the colorful, safe, affordable park with more than 25 attractions is now in its 10th season, and thus far it has welcomed more than 1.6 million guests from all 50 states and 73 other countries. Since the very beginning, admission for those with physical or cognitive disabilities has been free of charge.

Morgan's Wonderland recently unveiled the world's first ultra-accessible™ splash park – Morgan's Inspiration Island. It features five tropically-themed splash pads, the River Boat Adventure ride and extensive support facilities including the Wheelchair Valet, where guests in wheelchairs can transfer in private out of their chairs into special waterproof wheelchairs for maximum aquatic fun in the sun. This past September, TIME Magazine named Morgan's Inspiration Island to its listing of 100 World's Greatest Places. In addition, both Morgan's Inspiration Island and Morgan's Wonderland received the 2018 Barrier-Free America Award presented by the Paralyzed Veterans of America organization headquartered in Washington, D.C.

The guiding principle for Morgan's Wonderland and Morgan's Inspiration Island is inclusion. "These unique parks are special places where anyone and everyone can have fun," says Gordon Hartman, founder of The Gordon Hartman Family Foundation, which created the parks. "They're just like other theme parks except for the added benefit of a culture and environment that assures 100 percent enjoyment by everyone who enters through our Welcome Center. Unfortunately, countless children and adults with special needs do not have access to facilities that can help them fully enjoy outdoor recreation. We truly believe Morgan's Wonderland and Morgan's Inspiration Island are changing that."

Proceeds from the 2019 Texas Cavaliers River Parade will go to future capital improvements at Wonderland, Texas, site of the former Longhorn Quarry and home to Morgan's Wonderland and Morgan's Inspiration Island. These improvements are still in the planning stages, but it's anticipated that more details will be announced soon. In any case, the new additions promise to help thousands of children and adults with special needs.

Luke "Leon" Coffee grew up around horses, rodeo, and football. He competed as a junior rodeo contestant in bull riding, bareback riding, steer wrestling and calf roping. He joined the U.S. Army after high school and served for three years.

After the Army Coffee began fighting bulls instead of riding them. His signature act of dancing in front of an angry bull earned him the nicknames "Disco Bullfighter" and "Boogie Man." As a PRCA Gold Card Member and NRF barrel man, Coffee enjoyed a long and lively career in ProRodeo as one of only three cowboys to be both a barrel man and a bullfighter at the National Finals Rodeo.

Since 1973, the Texas cowboy fought bulls in the NRF twice (1979, 1984) and was a barrel man a the NFR in 1991, 1994, and 1997. "I enjoy putting smiles on faces, and my motto of life is God put me on Earth to do two things – make people happy and help people out, and I can do both in the arena." Coffee said.
